



These colourful display areas include not only costly items but also strictly guarded new product lines and manufacturing techniques of major interest to competitors. To ensure against "industrial espionage" as well as loss of expensive display items, security staff



on campus has been augmented with Bata International's own security officers.

During the period that Bata International is on campus, Food Service facilities are confined to allow maximum space for other purposes. Mr. J.R.
