CANADA COUNCIL AWARDS

Izaak Walton Killam Awards were given to the following members of the York University faculty:

Professor Robert C. Joyner, Faculty of Administrative Studies at York University, in association with Professor Kenneth W. Tunstall, also of the Faculty of Administrative Studies at York, and Mr. Ronald G. Ragsdale, Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, Toronto. The award of \$22,098 is in aid of further development and testing of a computer system to assist group problem-solving. The system is called CONCORD, for Conference Coordinator.

Canada Council research grants were awarded to the following members of the York University faculty:

Professor Anthony H. Richmond, Sociology, was awarded a grant of \$118,000 to continue research on housing and social integration of immigrants and ethnic groups in Toronto.

Professor Robert V. Presthus, Political Science, was awarded a grant of up to \$13,000 to continue research on the effectiveness of special interest groups in the Canadian political system.

Professor Vello Sermat, Psychological Services, was awarded a grant of \$11,850 to investigate the role of verbal communication in building up relationships between individuals.

Professor Paul M. Kohn, Psychology, was awarded a grant of \$11,575 for research on the psychology of authoritarianism in both leftist and rightist individuals.

Professor James Cutt, Economics, was awarded a grant of \$5,720 for research on a budgeting system for programmes involving the three levels of Canadian government, federal, provincial and municipal.

Professor Enrica Glickman, Humanities, was awarded a grant of \$5,616 for research on the impact of Italian literature on Latin American writers of the late 19th and early 20th centuries.
