

A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

The Laskin Committee on Rights and Responsibilities was struck in January 1968. It has already addressed itself to all the questions raised by Order on the Campus, and the work of the committee has advanced beyond the necessity of considering that document.

Order on the Campus is therefore irrelevant as far as York University is concerned. What other universities choose to do about Order on the Campus is their business, not ours. The Committee of Presidents of the Universities of Ontario sent the working paper to them for their consideration, without attempting to speak for any university or to bind any university. Universities can do what they please with it.

York University's response to the questions raised by Order on the Campus will be the report of the Laskin Committee. I am confident that it will be an example for other universities to study and that its influence will be far-reaching.
