When Jacob died in the army during the War of 1812, the land was left to his three daughters, Mrs. Joseph Holly, Catherine Fisher, and Mrs. Daniel Stong. Mrs. Stong outlived her sisters, and the farm was held by her descendants from 1816 until 1952 (except for a brief period during which a son-in-law named Garret cultivated it). In that year it was turned over to Central Mortgage and Housing and later was acquired by York University.
