- \* The Department of Safety and Security Services advises that work has been resumed on the water-main being installed by the Borough of North York on the west side of Keele Street.  
Weather permitting, the contractor should reach the main entrance to the University at St. Lawrence Boulevard this weekend. While the water-main is being installed across the entrance, there will be some restriction on traffic, but it is anticipated that the work can be completed without the entrance being entirely closed.
