- \* Because of occasional misunderstandings between the University Administration and the Student Body in general concerning student entrepreneurial activities, and because of contractual commitments to and possible conflict with Central Square tenants, it has become necessary to establish a policy with regard to retail sales operations in the University. York has endeavoured to make available to students, faculty and staff all non-academic goods and services at the lowest possible cost and from the most dependable suppliers. The University entered into contracts which guaranteed in every case that there would be no direct or indirect competition from any person associated or not associated with the University. Where any doubts exist that a proposed activity may constitute such competition, approval must be obtained from the Business Manager.
- \* The winners of the 8th annual competition for the C.D. Howe Memorial Fellowships were announced April 8, 1971. For the 1971 C.D. Howe Memorial Fellowships, the Foundation invited Prof. Wm. Kilbourn of York to supervise an extensive programme of research in Canadian History (1935-57) based on the C.D. Howe papers and it has awarded him a Fellowship that he may write a biography of the Rt. Honourable C.D. Howe. Dr. J.L. Granatstein, also of York University, was one of five persons to be awarded a special grant.
- \* Mr. Fred Simpkin, who has been conducting studies on the future development of the Computer Centre, will resume his day-to-day operational leadership of the Department of Computer Services effective immediately. Mr. Gordon Ramer, who for the past eight months has capably substituted for Mr. Simpkin, will now on a full time basis co-ordinate the planning of future facilities and services; Mr. Bruce Miller continues in charge of operations and in addition will put into effect the new charging procedures; Mr. Dick Riley will be directing special administrative programming projects within the department; Mrs. June Murphy continues in charge of academic advising, programme library, publications and programme development; and Mr. David Talbot will direct revamping work on the Financial system as well as maintain supervision of the recently revised Personnel-Payroll system. Each of the above will report directly to Mr. Simpkin.
