- \* At its April 16 meeting, the Committee of Presidents of Universities of Ontario (CPUO) changed its name by constitutional amendment to the "Council of Ontario Universities/ Conseil des Universités de l'Ontario". The new name will reflect more accurately the organization's current pattern of membership and range of activities. The address of the Council as of May 1, 1971, will be changed to 102 Bloor Street West, Toronto 181.
- \* An intensive T-group situation designed to further self-understanding and the development of interpersonal skills will be the focus of York University's third Human Relations Laboratory, to be held May 15-21 at a Georgian Bay resort. The goal of the programme is the personal growth of participants rather than group therapy. There are still a few places available for this year's session. ## GENERAL

- \* The appointment of Dr. Robert M. MacIntosh, B.A., M.A., Ph.D., as Chairman of the Board of Governors of York University has been announced by retiring Chairman William Pearson Scott. The appointment will be effective July 1, 1971. Dr. MacIntosh, 48, has been a member of the York University Board of Governors since December 1968 and is Deputy Chief General Manager of The Bank of Nova Scotia. Born in Stanstead, Que., he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree (Economics and Political Science) from McGill University in 1947, his Master of Arts in 1949 and his Doctor of Philosophy in 1952. Dr. MacIntosh also did post-graduate work at Trinity College, Cambridge, and served as an Assistant Professor of Economics at Bishop's University, Lennoxville, Quebec, from 1950 - 1953. He is married and father of two children. Mr. W.P. Scott has been a distinguished and dedicated member of the York Board of Governors since the inception of the University in 1959 and has served as Chairman since January 1, 1966.
