Fees for 1971-72 are as follows: Annual Reserved permit - \$75.00; Annual Unreserved permit - \$25.00; Sessional permit (Atkinson students only) - \$5.00 per course; Motorcycles - \$2.00; Registration is free, allowing parking in designated peripheral lot only on payment of daily fee of 50¢.
Due to the fiscal year of the University ending April 30th, 1972, annual permits will be sold on a pro rata basis as follows:
Annual Reserved ---- \$62.50
Annual Unreserved -- \$22.50
Permits will expire April 30th, 1972. Fees may be paid in cash at the Accounting Office, T.O.B. or arrangements may be made for the appropriate payroll deduction. Permits will not be issued to applicants having outstanding parking violations. 1970-71 permits are no longer valid.

1. 2.
