On June 6 and 7, forty-two papers will be presented by members of CRESS on their current research in Astronomy and Astrophysics, Aeronomy and Atmospheric Science, Lasers, Spectroscopy, Chemical Physics, Theoretical Chemistry, and Physics and Plasma Phenomena. On June 8, two special 'focal' sessions will be provided by invited speakers. The morning session is on "Reflection Spectroscopy and Remote Sensing". In this session various aspects of the Canadian program on Remote Sensing will be reviewed. The afternoon session, "Atomic Spectra, Autoionisation and Astrophysics", is held in honour of the award of honorary Doctor of Science degrees at the June 9th Convocation to Professor A.G. Shenstone, F.R.S. (Princeton) and Professor W.R.S. Garton, F.R.S. (Imperial College, London). Professor Shenstone will speak on "Fifty Years of Atomic Spectroscopy"; Professor Garton's topic is "Autoionisation Studies in Atomic Spectra"; Dr. F.S. Tompkins (Argonne National Laboratory) will speak on "Atomic Spectra and the Quadratic Zeeman Effect"; and Professor A.M. Crooker (University of British Columbia) will speak on "Atomic Spectra of Astrophysical Importance in the Extreme Vacuum Ultraviolet".

- * MONDAY is again running its' co-operative camp for teens from Edgeley, an Ontario Housing Development immediately adjacent to the York campus. The eleven Scholarships are allotted as follows: two each to Ontario and Quebec, and one each to Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Nova Scotia and Saskatchewan.
