



Members of the York community are asked to note the following summary of the Amendment of the Immigration Appeal Board Act (Bill C-197), introduced in the House of Commons on June 18, 1973. The amendment is of special interest to faculty and students who have lived in Canada since November 30, 1972, without a legal claim to residence.

- The Bill provides that persons who do not have legal claim to residence and who were in Canada as of November 30, 1972, and have remained in Canada since that date may apply for change of status provided they register at a Canada Immigration Centre within 60 days of the proclamation of the Act. Persons who do not apply within the specified period to regularize their status will have no further opportunity to apply within Canada for landed immigrant status and will lose future appeal rights, and will be subject to deportation.

- A six-day intensive course in precision teaching will be held by the National Institute on Mental Retardation from August 20-25 at the N.I.M.R. on the York campus. The course will offer a working introduction to precision teaching aimed at practical application in the classroom or residential setting and would be of interest to administrators, teachers, residential counsellors, therapists, etc. For further information, call Mrs. Bonner at 661-9611.





 - The following summary of the Amendment of the Immigration Appeal Board Act (Bill C-197), introduced in the House of Commons on June 18, 1973 will be of special interest to faculty and students who have lived in Canada since November 30, 1972, without a legal claim to residence.

- The Bill provides that persons who do not have legal claim to residence and who were in Canada as of November 30, 1972, and have remained in Canada since that date may apply for change of status provided they register at a Canada Immigration Centre within 60 days of the proclamation of the Act. Persons who do not apply within the specified period to regularize their status will have no further opportunity to apply within Canada for landed immigrant status and will lose future appeal rights, and will be subject to deportation.

The Department of Manpower and Immigration in association with the Canadian Bureau for International Education is sponsoring the Canada-Mexico Exchange Program for Young Specialists and Technicians. The program involves young Canadians taking practical training in mexico in the areas of transportation, housing, library sciences, ecology and agriculture. The selected participants will work for a period of four to twelve months with Mexican companies, organizations or institutions. 



TTC BUS SERVICE ON CAMPUS

A resolution moved by Controller Barbara Greene of North York, and approved by the North York Council on May 28, requested that the TTC extend its on-campus bus route so that the four graduate residences would have better access to the service the TTC already provides on campus. The request for this service was approved by the TTC on June 12 and the new routing will go into effect on Sunday, July 22, 1973.


The service affected is route Keele 41B, which enters the campus at St. Lawrence Boulevard, has a stop near Winters College, and continues along Fraser Drive, entering Steeles Avenue by Ottawa Boulevard.

With the new service, the St. Lawrence entrance will continue to be used <u>during rush hours only</u>, that is, by those 41B buses that leave the Winters bus stop between 6:00 a.m. and 8:57 a.m., and by those buses that leave the Winters stop between 3:07 p.m. and 6:27 p.m. Detailed timetables are given below. 
At all other times on weekdays, and all day on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, <u>all</u> 41B buses will enter the campus by the Murray Ross Parkway, turn north on Niagara Boulevard to a new stop at parking lot 'J' (see map). They will continue along Fraser Drive to the Winters bus stop (which will continue to operate) and leave the campus by Ottawa Boulevard. Until a permanent bus stop is installed at parking lot 'J', the stop is designated a request stop and passengers should flag the bus down.



TTC BUS SERVICE ON CAMPUS:

A resolution moved by Controller Barbara Greene of North York, and approved by the North York Council on May 28, requested that the TTC extend its on-campus bus route so that the four graduate residences would have better access to the service the TTC already provides on campus. The request for this service was approved by the TTC on June 12 and the new routing will go into effect on Sunday, July 22, 1973.

The service affected is route Keele 41B, which enters the campus at St. Lawrence Boulevard, has a stop near Winters College, and continues along Fraser Drive, entering Steeles Avenue by Ottawa Boulevard.

With the new service, the St. Lawrence entrance will continue to be used <u>during rush hours</u> only, that is, by those 41B buses that leave the Winters bus stop between 6:00 a.m. and 8:57 a.m., and by those buses that leave the Winters stop between 3:07 p.m. and 6:27 p.m. At all other times on weekdays, and all day on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, <u>all</u> 41B buses will enter the campus by the Murray Ross Parkway, turn north on Niagara Boulevard to a new stop at parking lot 'J'. They will continue along Fraser Drive to the Winters bus stop (which will continue to operate) and leave the campus by Ottawa Boulevard. Until a permanent bus stop is installed at parking lot 'J', the stop is designated a request stop and passengers should flag the bus down.






