- allowing the pre-ordering of long-delivery items of equipment, etc.; and carrying out the work at minimum cost through avoidance of hiring additional staff not really required, etc.

- Status Report on Y.U.S.A.'s Application for Certification: Eight months have now elapsed since Y.U.S.A. filed its application with the Ontario Labour Relations Board (OLRB) in December 1974. As the University and Y.U.S.A. could not agree over which positions should be excluded from the proposed group that might be represented by Y.U.S.A., it was necessary for an OLRB Examiner to conduct a lengthy series of fact finding meetings at the University. These meetings have now been completed and the findings are being combined into a Report by the Examiner which he will forward to the OLRB to enable them to reach a decision on Y.U.S.A.'s application. This Report contains the facts as presented by all parties involved in the various meetings but in itself draws no conclusions and makes no recommendations. Upon receipt of the Report - expected quite soon - the OLRB will set a date for a formal Hearing at which time the University and Y.U.S.A. will present their separate arguments, each requesting the OLRB to reach a decision on the application consistent with that party's particular point of view. At the Hearing - probably to be set for late September or early October - the OLRB will consider the contents of the Report, listen to the various points of view and then reach a decision over the definition of the proposed Bargaining Unit - that is, which positions might properly be in the unit, which positions might be excluded. Following this Hearing the OLRB will review Y.U.S.A.'s membership numbers as of the date of the original application -December 1974 - and then either issue a certificate without any further proceedings or instruct that a vote among current bargaining unit members be taken. If the former is the case, negotiations to arrive at a Collective Agreement covering all persons in the bargaining unit could start. If the latter event is ordered a simple majority of the ballots cast at the time of the vote would determine whether or not a certificate would then be issued. Further information relating to the progress of the Application, including the date set for the Hearing when that has been set, will appear in the Bulletin.
