Such acts not only jeopardize the safety of other passengers, but they also result in unnecessary down-time, inconvenience and impose heavy restoration costs on the University. It is essential, in the interests of personal safety, that persons trapped in elevators remain calm and promptly summon assistance by utilizing the elevator emergency telephone (which provides direct contact with the Emergency Services Centre where trained operators are on duty 24 hours a day). Prying open doors or climbing through hatches should not be attempted as the elevator may be between floors or may move without warning. During normal working hours an elevator company mechanic is on call for emergencies at the York campus; after hours, the company standby mechanic service is contacted by the Emergency Services Centre for assistance. These services are supplemented by Safety and Security personnel equipped with resuscitator and first aid kits. - E.C. Richards, Safety Officer.
