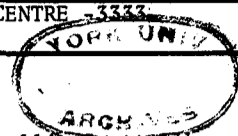

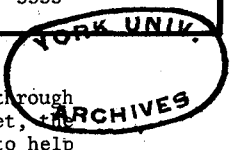

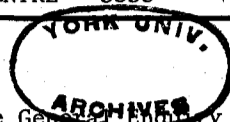

COMPLETE SEALING OF MAIL - OPEN WINDOW ENVELOPES AND SELF MAILERS

The Canada Post Office is presently installing automatic mail processing and sortation equipment in key postal facilities across Canada. As we move closer to finalizing this mechanization programme, it has become increasingly important to ensure that our new equipment and facilities will function with as little disruption as possible in order to provide our customers with the maximum benefits of machine processing.

We have found it necessary to revise our regulations so as to make the full sealing of mail a requisite, thereby eliminating such unsealed items as open "self-mailers" and open window envelopes from the mail stream.

1. First Class Mail (Canada and International)
All envelopes or self-mailers posted as first class mail after June 30, 1976, must be completely sealed.
2. Second Class Mail
After June 30, 1976, any envelope containing second class mail and which does not exceed:
 - i) 6 inches in width
 - ii) 10 inches in length
 - iii) 1/4 inch in thickness
 - iv) 2 ounces in weightmust be completely sealed.
3. Third Class Mail
All envelopes or self-mailers posted as Domestic Third Class mail after June 30, 1976, must be completely sealed.
4. Prohibited Mail
Window envelopes will be prohibited from the mail stream unless:
 - i) each window has a transparent covering.
 - ii) the longest dimension of the window through which the address is visible is parallel to the length of the envelope.

The full sealing requirement will extend to all sizes of envelopes and self-mailers in the Domestic and International First Class and in the Domestic Third Class mail streams; full sealing will also apply to envelopes containing Domestic Second Class mail if the envelopes fall in the size limits quoted.

Unsealed items and open window envelopes found in the mail stream after June 30, 1976, will be returned to the sender or if no return address is visible on the outside cover, they could be destroyed.

While the sealing of mail will not be mandatory until July 1, 1976, we will be permitting the sealing of stamped Third Class mail, beginning prior to the Christmas mailing season. Meter and Permit mail can already be sealed.
