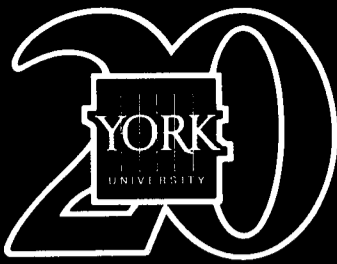

- * The Department of Physical Plant wishes to advise the community that the Ministry of Colleges and Universities has approved a request for Capital assistance to reconstruct the intersection of Fraser Drive and Niagara Boulevard. In addition, capital funds have been made available to construct the permanent western section of Fraser Drive from Niagara Boulevard to the Hoover Homestead intersection. For many years the University has been maintaining the existing original farm road. However, vehicular traffic including TTC buses has increased dramatically over the past few years necessitating major repairs. A cost benefit analysis was undertaken by our consultant who has recommended constructing the new road in conformance with the Master Plan rather than spending considerably money on an annual basis. Construction of the new road will alleviate the need for spending any more University operating funds on the existing section of the farm road. Work is starting immediately and there will be necessary disruption to normal traffic for the next several weeks. Therefore all persons who usually use these intersections are urged to use one of the many alternate routes to and from the campus.

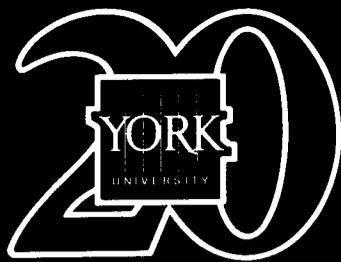

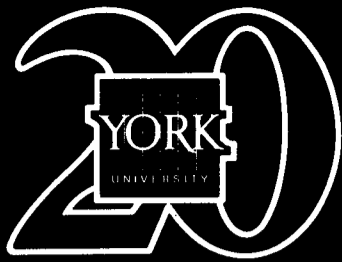

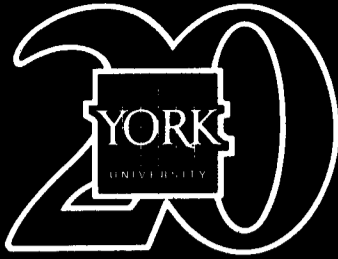
