Textbooks: Ordering Policy Since 1978, it has been the policy of the University Bookstores to order course books in quantities as close to 100% of faculty requests as possible. Effectively, this has meant that in courses where a rational number of titles (ten or less) is required, faculty enrolment estimates have been accepted by the Bookstores without question. The results of this policy have been:

- a) better service to the academic community
- b) increased customer satisfaction

c) higher costs due to ever-increasing inventories and excessively high interest rates d) unreturnable book overstocks for which there is no real market. Seeking to enhance the present level of service, the staff of the Bookstores would like to bring to the community's attention the fact that inventory-financing costs reached \$91,394 in 1980/81, were in excess of \$130,000 in 1981/82, and are expected to exceed \$165,000 in 1982/83. In view of this, and to ensure the Bookstores come within reach of our breakeven mandate, we would encourage faculty in their efforts to provide us with accurate course enrolment estimates in the coming year. We are certain faculty share our desire to see unproductive, inventoryfinancing costs are kept to an absolute minimum. There is no doubt that, with the co-operation of all concerned, this goal can be achieved.
