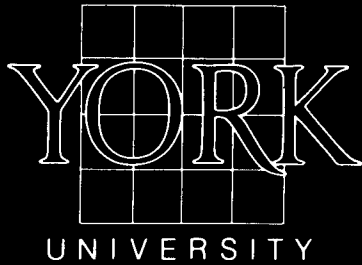

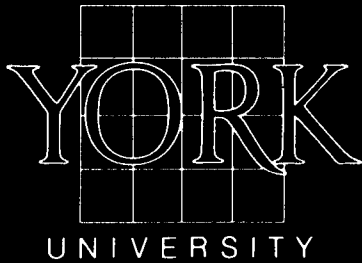

More than 3,000 undergraduate and graduate students will receive their degrees at the following ceremonies:
- Friday, June 10, 2:30 p.m.- Osgoode Hall Law School
Mr. Justice Jean-Marie P.J. Beetz, Judge of the Supreme Court and former Special Counsel to the Prime Minister of Canada on constitutional affairs, will receive the honorary Doctor of Laws degree and address Convocation. The ceremony will take place on the West Quadrangle Lawn, Glendon campus; the Dining Hall is the alternate site in case of inclement weather.
- Saturday, June 11, 2:30 p.m.- Glendon College
Reverend Roger Guindon, Rector of the University of Ottawa, will be awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws degree and he will deliver the Convocation address. Rev. Guindon has played an important role in the development of higher education for Franco-Ontarians. The ceremony will take place on the West Quadrangle Lawn, Glendon campus; in case of inclement weather, in the Dining Hall.
- Thursday, June 16, 10:00 a.m.- Founders, McLaughlin and Stong Colleges
One of the world's most eminent geographers, Peter Haggett, Pro-Vice-Chancellor and Professor of Urban and Regional Geography at the University of Bristol (England), will receive an honorary Doctor of Science degree and address Convocation.
- Thursday, June 16, 2:30 p.m.- Faculties of Administrative Studies, Environmental Studies and Graduate Studies
Sir David R. Bates, recognized as the international father figure of atomic and molecular physics as applied to atmospheric and astrophysical processes, will receive the Doctor of Science degree and address Convocation. An honorary Doctor of Laws degree will be conferred on Jean-Guy Paquet, Rector of Laval University.
- Four York faculty members will be made Distinguished Research Professor at this afternoon's ceremonies: Ralph Nicholls, Professor of Physics and Director of York's Centre for Research in Experimental Space Science; Huw Pritchard, Professor of Chemistry; John O'Neill, Professor of Sociology; and, Professor of English, Beryl Rowland (Professor Rowland's title will be Distinguished Research Professor Emeritus).
- Friday, June 17, 10:00 a.m.- Faculty of Fine Arts, Vanier and Winters Colleges
Poet Louis Dudek, described as "one of Canada's most influential literary figures", will receive an honorary Doctor of Letters degree and address Convocation.
- Friday, June 17, 2:30 p.m.- Faculties of Education and Science, Calumet and Bethune Colleges
The honorary Doctor of Science degree will be conferred on Vincent J. Schaeffer, a leading atmospheric scientist and researcher; Dr. Schaeffer will give the Convocation address.
- Saturday, June 18, 10:30 a.m.- Atkinson College
Educator, author and former missionary, James G. Endicott, an active participant in many of the world's struggles for peace, nuclear disarmament and social justice, will receive the honorary Doctor of Laws degree and address Convocation.
- The first two ceremonies will take place at the Glendon College campus and the five other York Convocation ceremonies will be held on the podium level of the Ross Building with the Tait McKenzie Centre as an alternate site in case of inclement weather.

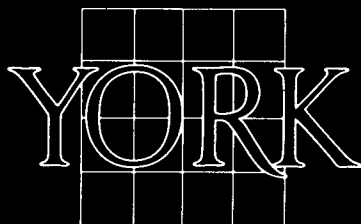

Obituary

G. Allan Roeher, a visiting professor in York's Faculty of Environmental Studies since 1979, died June 2 in the Air Canada plane fire in Cincinnati. He was one of Canada's foremost leaders in the field of mental retardation and human services and was a strong advocate on behalf of the rights of the mentally retarded to participate fully in their communities. Professor Roeher was Founding Director of the National Institute on Mental Retardation, located at the York campus, from 1966 to 1976. Professor Roeher's family has requested that in lieu of flowers, donations be made to the G. Allan Roeher Training Fund in care of the National Institute on Mental Retardation (Kinsmen Building, York Campus). The funeral will be held on Thursday, June 9 at 11:00 a.m. in St. Luke's Lutheran Church, 3200 Bayview Avenue (Bayview/Finch), with a reception to follow the services at the Kinsmen Building.

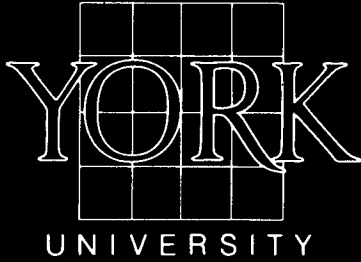

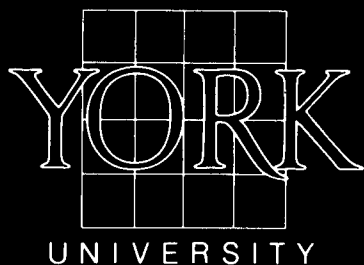
EMERGENCY SERVICES CENTRE -3333

On Friday, June 5, at a meeting called by President Macdonald, he announced to a large group of visa students that at the next meeting of the York University Board of Governors, he would propose that an Emergency Fund be established to assist new visa students. Specifically, the fund would be intended to assist those visa students who are facing financial difficulties as a result of the large increase in foreign student fees resulting from provincial government fee policy for the 1983-84 academic year.

To those visa students who entered in 1982-83 and who can demonstrate their financial need, the proposed Emergency Fund would make available financial assistance sufficient to cover the difference between their 1982-83 academic fees, plus 5%, and the new 1983-84 fees.

The Emergency Fund applications will be received immediately. If approved, the fund would be in full operation before the end of June and would be administered by a special panel. Applications for assistance would be processed as simply and swiftly as possible to enable students to meet registration deadlines for all 1983-84 academic sessions.

Noting that the proposed Emergency Fund could cost the University an estimated \$175,000 to implement, President Macdonald called for student support and cooperation in achieving this goal of providing financial assistance for visa students. Accordingly, he recommended that the visa students conclude their occupation of the 9th floor corridor of the Ross Building, thereby assisting the administration in its recommendation to the Board of Governors. It would also serve to support the University in its ongoing representation to the Ontario Government and the people of Ontario in opposition to the principle of differential fees which are both discriminatory and, for the long-term, not in the interests of Canada.

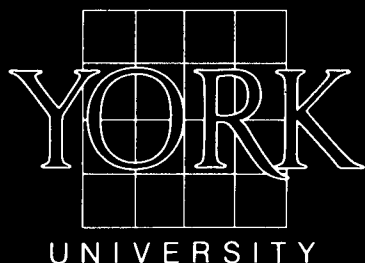

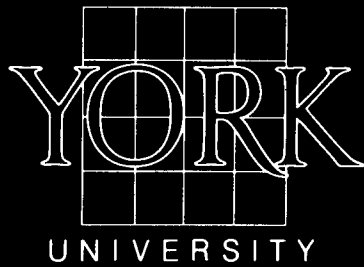
