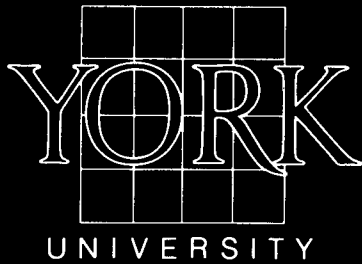

## GENERAL

- \* August 1, 1983 - Civic Holiday - The University Offices will be closed on this day.
- \* The 1983-84 York Telephone Directory will be issued by November 1st, 1983. The cut-off date for any deletions and/or changes will be September 9, 1983. This year's edition will be a revision of the 1982-83 directory. Additions, deletions and/or changes to the alphabetical listings must be submitted on a "Change of Listing" form to the Telecommunications Office, Room C5 of the Temporary Office Building; a supply of these forms may be obtained by calling local -2337. Please note that one form is required per person. Special care should be taken when submitting listings for faculty who are cross-appointed. In these cases it is advisable to liaise with the other department/college involved. If changes have occurred in the "Departmental Listing" the department involved is required to submit, on a separate typed sheet the complete Departmental Listing (i.e. not merely the changes) as it is to appear in the new directory. If there are no changes to the 1982-83 listing, a memo to that effect should be sent to the Telecommunications Office before the cut-off date. When submitting the new Departmental Listing (or "no change" memo) departments should also indicate how many Directory inserts are required. The last day on which it will be possible to process change of listing forms/departmental listing sheets for inclusion in the 1983-84 York Directory will be September 9, 1983; after this date, any additions, changes or deletions should continue to be submitted on the "Change of Listing" form in order that the University Switchboard files may be updated accordingly.
- \* Procedures for the establishment of a Search Committee for a new President at York University have been finalised. The Committee is to be composed of 11 members -- 6 to be appointed by the Board of Governors and 5 to be elected by Senate, and distributed as follows:

For the remaining six months of the year, the surcharge will be 5% on a retroactive basis to reflect the true annual rate.
