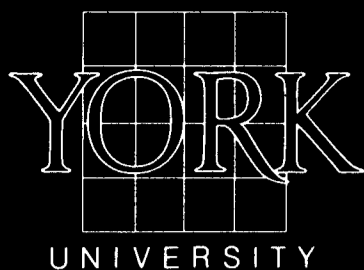

While this construction is on-going, the TTC bus terminal outside the Ross Building has temporarily been relocated to the bus stop on the west side of Fraser Drive, south of Winters College residence. Normal service should be restored in mid-August.

- * On August 13, a two-mile long parade involving over 1,000 people, 25 floats, 60 vehicles (including antique cars and motorcycles), 10 military and secondary school marching bands, clowns, horses, plus other surprises, will be lead by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Mounted Unit and Canada's official Pied Piper, Bobby Gimby and children from North York's Elementary Schools. The parade will pass a reviewing stand located on the York campus, where a replica of a turn-of-the-century Ontario village has been erected for the 1983 Flax Festival. The 1983 Flax Festival is modelled after that held in 1918 by the Canadian Red Cross to raise funds for civilian relief in war-torn France. Proceeds from the 1983 event are to go toward construction of new facilities for the North York and District Branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society. Activities will take place on the York campus commencing at noon on August 11 and continue to August 14. There will be an Olde Tyme Midway, a Children's Village, Beer Tent, Exhibits and Booths, a fly-past of World War Two Aircraft, Hot Air Balloon demonstrations, and many more events. 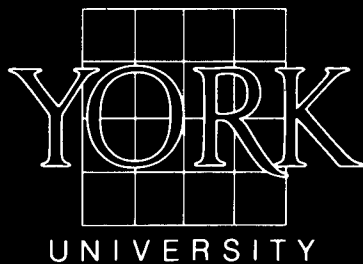
