PROFESSOR HARRY ARTHURS PRESIDENT ELECT OF YORK UNIVERSITY

TORONTO, June 13, 1984: The appointment of Harry William Arthurs, Professor of Law at Osgoode Hall Law School, as President Elect of York University has been announced by R. Bruce Bryden, Chairman of the Board of Governors. Professor Arthurs' appointment will be effective January 1, 1985. Dr. William C. Found, Vice-President (Academic Affairs) has been appointed Acting President for the period September 1, 1984 to January 1, 1985.

In announcing the appointment of Professor Arthurs, Mr. Bryden paid tribute to retiring President H. Ian Macdonald. "Under President Macdonald's term, the University has flourished," said Mr. Bryden. "York University is now the third largest university in Canada. York has come of age and is of national and international stature."

President Macdonald will step down September 1, after more than ten years in office, to teach in the Faculty of Administrative Studies and to develop the University's Office of International Studies into York International. He will also continue in his position as Chairman of the IDEA Corporation.

In making the announcement, Mr. Bryden also expressed his appreciation of the interest in the University demonstrated by the other nominees, all of whom had the highest qualifications.

A Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, Professor Harry Arthurs was awarded a Killam Research Fellowship in March of this year, which he is accepting for a six-month period. The Killam Research Fellowships are designed to support scholars of exceptional ability engaged in research projects of outstanding merit.

A native Torontonian, born in 1935, Professor Arthurs received his Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws degrees from the University of Toronto and his Master's degree from the Harvard Law School in 1959. He was called to the Bar of Ontario in 1961 and that same year joined the faculty of the Osgoode Hall Law School as an Assistant Professor. He was appointed full Professor in 1968.

During the period 1965-69, Professor Arthurs played an active role in securing the affiliation of the law school with York University. He was actively involved in the development of the new Osgoode Hall Law School where he served as planning coordinator, as chairman of the academic policy committee and as Associate Dean. In 1972, Professor Arthurs was appointed Dean of the Osgoode Hall Law School of York University and served in that capacity until 1977.

Following his Deanship, while concentrating primarily on his scholarly work, Professor Arthurs undertook several major external assignments as a member of the Economic Council of Canada and as a Bencher of the Law Society of Upper Canada, the legal profession's governing body. From 1980 to 1983, he served as chairman of the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada's Consultative Group on Research and Education in Law, which produced Law and Learning, the first national study on these subjects. This study has attracted attention from legal and academic institutions around the world.

Professor Arthurs has brought new historical insights to the area of Administrative Law which help the courts establish standards for review of administrative decisions. He has contributed significantly to the legal and social aspects of labour-management relations. More recently, he has turned his attention to writing about the legal profession itself.

Professor Arthurs has served as President of the Canadian Civil Liberties Association, and continues his affiliation as the Association's Past President.

As President of York University, Professor Arthurs will support and encourage the quality of intellectual life in the University. He is also concerned with the quality of community life, and believes it is important to bring the campus together as a community, both physically and socially.
