GENERAL

Subject - Safeguarding of York University Keys

The Department of Security and Safety Service wishes to remind faculty and staff members of the importance of taking special care to prevent keys from falling into the hands of unauthorized persons, thus exposing the property of the University and the personal property of faculty and staff members to theft or unauthorized use.

When not being used, keys should be left in a safe place, preferably one which can be locked up and should not be left in locks, on tops of desks, in unsecured envelopes under blotters or similar places.

In the event that keys are lost, the pertinent information should be reported immediately to Special Services Unit of the Department of Security and Safety Service [Room 44 East Office Building] in writing. The Special Services Unit will be responsible for investigation of loss, arranging replacement of keys or, if necessary, having locks changed.

Keys which are found should be turned over to the Department of Security and Safety Service or to the nearest Security Officer.

Keys should not be lent to other persons by the authorized custodians. If additional keys are required these may be requested in writing from the Security and Safety Service.

Any obsolete keys which were left over by former office or room occupants for desks, filing cabinets, should be returned to the Locksmith's Shop located in Room 135 Physical Plant Workshops.

York University's Department of Safety and Security Services has been informed by the University of Toronto Police that during the past month there have been a number of wallet thefts on the U of T campus. If a bank machine card is found in the wallet, a man identifying himself as a bank officer is known to phone the person from whom he stole the wallet; he uses the name Mr. Waters.

This man then claims to have caught a person using the victim's bank machine card, and in order to confirm identification he requests their personal identification number. If given, the victims discover a short time later a large withdrawal was made on their accounts.

The University Police caution everybody to safeguard their purses and wallets, notify police and banks of <u>all</u> thefts, not tell <u>anybody</u> their personal bank card identification number and report any suspicious persons in/or around their office.
