### GENERAL

During regular patrols, members of the York Security staff have observed that desk drawers are being used for storing room, cabinet and desk keys. Access to these keys, even if desk drawers are locked at the end of the working day, is relatively easy and can be accomplished by the use of items readily available in any office, such as letter openers and metal rulers. The Department of Security and Safety Service recommends that at the end of each working day these keys be removed from desk drawers and secured in a safe location such as a safe, a locked metal filing cabinet or taken home. This will no longer permit an easy means of illegal entry to the remainder of the office suite or set of offices. Anyone having out-of-date, surplus or unwanted keys should return them to Mr. Robert Hayman, local -7288, who will either collect the keys personally or make arrangements for their collection. Members of the York community are asked to refrain from forwarding keys through the mail as it is not considered a safe method.

The Department of Security and Safety Service reminds all members of the York community that they can be of great assistance to the Department in combatting the recent rash of break-ins and thefts perpetrated campus-wide. Attractive, moveable items should be locked away at the end of each day, offices should be locked whenever the occupant is absent, even for the shortest time, and that discretion is exercised when talking or working in the company of strangers. Security Control should be notified immediately if any suspicious persons or actions are noted.
